

Sarah B. White, MD, MS, FSIR is an Associate Professor in the Division of Vascular & Interventional Radiology at the Medical College of Wisconsin. She received her MD from the New Jersey Medical School in Newark and completed her residency/fellowship in the Diagnostic & Interventional Radiology Enhanced Clinical Training Pathway (DIRECT) at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. Dr. White was also honored as the Constantine Cope Cook Interventional Radiology endowed fellow at the University of Pennsylvania.

More recently, she obtained a master's degree in Clinical Investigation from Northwestern University in August of 2014. She began her career in research in a molecular biology laboratory at the University of Pennsylvania and has since spent time at the NIH. Dr. White was the recipient of the Society of Interventional Radiology's Dr. Gary J. Becker Young Investigator Award in 2016 and has received numerous other awards for research from other organizations, including the Association of University Radiologists, the Radiologic Society of North America, Cardiovascular and Interventional Radiological Society of Europe.

Dr. White currently sees patients at Froedtert Hospital and the Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center, specializing in Vascular & Interventional Radiology and Interventional Oncology. She has a translational Interventional Oncology laboratory that focuses on site selective delivery of new nanotechnology-based drug delivery platforms for the treatment of primary and metastatic liver tumors.
